LOS ANGELES ART SHOW AND FINE PRINT FAIR TO ACT AS ANCHOR EVENT FOR LOS ANGELES ART MONTH

(Los Angeles – November 2008) The 24th Annual Los Angeles/IFPDA Fine Print Fair will open in conjunction with the Los Angeles Art Show January 22 - 25, 2009 at the Los Angeles Convention Center. The Los Angeles/IFPDA Fine Print Fair joined the LA Art Show in 2008, both expanding and added a new and unique element to the then thirteen-year old Art Fair.

As LA Art Show producer Kim Martindale states, 'it is our goal to elevate and celebrate art. To bridge gaps between arts communities and genres on local, national and international levels so that not one form is revered more than another but rather all art is and should be saluted.'

Exhibitors of the Fine Print Fair are all members of the exclusive International Fine Print Dealers Association. Established in 1987, the IFPDA now has over 160 members in 13 countries. The Fair offers collectors and art lovers a comprehensive look at Prints in all techniques. Visitors will have an opportunity to view and purchase fine prints across a broad spectrum of price from Old Master, German Expressionist, antique and modern Japanese, 18th and 19th-century European, 19th-century American, American Regionalist, Latin-American, and Modern works to Contemporary masterworks and new editions.

The LA Fine Print Fair and Art Show will act as the anchor event for the first Annual Los Angeles Arts Month. The city of Los Angeles, Department of Cultural Affairs has recently passed a resolution declaring January 2009 as Los Angeles Art Month. This year will bring will be a multi-hued cornucopia of arts within the city of Los Angeles. Additional programming includes lectures, movies, music, dance, art walks & exhibitions.
